Speak & Read ™Parents' Guide

The Speak & Read TM educational product is designed for beginning readers of all ages—preschoolers, kindergartners, first graders in beginning reading programs, and older students developing basic reading skills. The activities and stories contain words commonly used in most beginning reading series. Eight word cartridges (sold separately) provide variety and broaden reading vocabulary. The Speak & Read unit and the You Can Read! book are designed to help your child have fun while developing skills in reading.

Exciting Activities

The Speak & Read activities were developed with the guidance of some of the nation's foremost reading specialists. The Speak & Read unit provides your child with practice in phonics, sight-word recognition, and reading comprehension.

Six educational activities can add fun and excitement to your child's reading experience. Activities allow your child to hear words as well as see them and encourage your child to develop a basic reading vocabulary. Activities provide the correct answer in the display if your child gives an incorrect response.

The You Can Read! Book

The You Can Read! book included with your Speak & Read unit has three sections.

- The Picture Read section works with the Speak & Read unit to help your child develop vocabulary and comprehension.
- 2. A story section lets your child practice vocabulary words from the word list.
- An activities section lets your child apply and practice newly acquired reading skills.

Word Cartridges for the Speak & Read Unit

You can choose from eight exciting word cartridges (sold separately) for your child. Each cartridge has a different word list for specific reading skills and reading levels.

Exploring with Your Child

Help your child learn to use the Speak & Read unit for the first time. Explain the directions for each activity (refer to "Basic Operations") and show your child how to use the You Can Read! book.

Explain to your child that the unit does not always respond to keys instantly. For example, the unit does not respond if it is providing a correct answer to an incorrect response.


Battery Installation

With proper care and maintenance of the unit, the Speak & Read educational product can provide years of educational enjoyment for your child. Installing batteries is simple and easy. You can also purchase an AC Adapter to conserve batteries or an earphone to use for private listening (see "Optional Accessories").

Installing Batteries

The Speak & Read unit requires four "C" cell alkaline batteries. To install batteries, follow these steps.

 Remove the battery compartment door by prying gently with a key, coin, or similar object.



- Insert the batteries as shown in the illustration located inside the battery compartment.
- 3. Replace the battery compartment door.

Low Battery Information

The batteries in the Speak & Read unit provide approximately 15 hours of actual use. Replace the batteries if you observe any of the following difficulties while using your Speak & Read unit.

- ▲ Erratic or dim display
- ▲ Erratic performance
- ▲Imprecise word pronunciation or unusual and unexpected sounds or tones
- ▲ No effect when keys are pressed
- ▲ Unusual or inconsistent operation


Cartridge Installation

W ord cartridges expand the built-in vocabulary of the Speak & Read educational product. You can install a word cartridge easily by following the directions below.

Installing Cartridges

To install a word cartridge, follow these steps.

- Remove the battery compartment door by prying gently with a key, coin, or similar object.
- 2. Remove the batteries from the Speak & Read unit.
- Insert the cartridge with the label facing up, as shown in the illustration.




Important: Firm pressure may be required to insert the cartridge the first time. Press the cartridge in as far as it will go to ensure that the battery compartment door will close correctly.

- Replace the batteries as shown in the illustration located inside the battery compartment.
- 5. Replace the battery compartment door.

Removing Cartridges

If you wish to remove a word cartridge, follow the first two steps listed above. Then:

 Remove the cartridge by prying gently with a key, coin, or similar object.



2. Replace the batteries and the battery compartment door.

Note: If you experience difficulty with a word cartridge after installation, remove and reinsert the word cartridge one or two times to ensure that it connects properly with the Speak & Read unit.

Special Keys

Key

Show your child the keys on the Speak & Read unit. The letter keys are in alphabetical order, and other keys serve special functions, such as selecting an activity and turning the unit on and off. If your child forgets to turn the unit off, the device has an APDTM (Automatic Power Down) feature which turns off the device after four minutes of non-use.

Function

runction
Turns the device off.
Begins an activity or continues play in Hear It and Letter Stumper.
Repeats answers in Hear It, and instructions in Read It and Picture Read.
Zaps a word during the Word Zap activity.
Selects the Word Maker activity.
Selects the Read It activity.
Selects the Picture Read activity.
Selects the Letter Stumper activity.
Selects the Hear It activity.
Turns the unit on and selects the Word Zap activity. Use the * Word Zapper key to zap a word in the activity.
Puts an apostrophe in the display.
Accesses the new word list when a cartridge is in place. Press again to get the Speak & Read built-in reading word list without removing the cartridge.
Erases an answer in the display if used before ENTER is pressed. It cannot be used with Word Zap and Letter Stumper.
Completes an answer. The Speak & Read unit then checks it automatically.

Basic Operations

I our child begins by pressing ON. Your child sees ZAP 1 in the display and hears a tune and "Word Zap, Level 1." Your child can either begin playing Word Zap immediately or can select any of the other five activities. If your child wants to use Word Zap, he or she begins the activity by following the directions given with the Word Zap activity. If your child wants to practice another activity, he or she presses the key for that activity and follows the directions given.

Word Zap

Word Zap encourages skills in sight-word recognition. There are three levels of speed. Level 1 is the slowest; Level 3, the fastest.

To use the Word Zap activity, your child:

- 1. Presses the ON WORD ZAP/ON key.
- 2. Sees ZAP 1 in the display and hears a tune and "Word Zap, Level 1."
- 3. Selects a speed level by pressing

 (in) WORD ZAP/ON until the desired level appears in the display.
- 4. Presses Go GO to begin.
- 5. Hears "Zap (a word)."
- Watches the display as three words appear, one at a time.
- Presses the WORD ZAPPER key when the word appears in the display.

If the incorrect word is "zapped," your child hears a tone and sees the correct word displayed. After five groups of three words each, your child's score is displayed and spoken.

Note: The \bigcirc REPLAY and \bigcirc ERASE keys cannot be used in Word Zap.

Hear It

Hear It allows your child to enter any word on the word list and hear it pronounced. (For the Word List, see page 3.)

To access Hear It, your child:

- 1. Presses the HEAR IT key.
- 2. Presses 60 GO to begin.
- 3. Hears "Which word?" and sees a cursor in the display.
- 4. Enters the letter keys to spell the word he or she wants to hear.
- 5. Presses **ENTER** to complete the spelling.
- 6. Hears the word pronounced.

If your child enters a word that is not on the word list, he or she hears "Not found."

Note: Your child can press the REPLAY key to hear the same word repeated or the GO key to hear another word.

Letter Stumper

Letter Stumper uses three levels of difficulty to help your child develop memory skills. Level 1 asks your child to repeat a sequence of a maximum of five letters; Level 2, nine letters. Level 3 instructs your child to say the sequence of letters in reverse order and uses a maximum of six letters.

To play Letter Stumper, your child:

- 1. Presses the LETTER STUMPER key.
- 2. Sees STUMPER 1 and hears "Letter Stumper, Level 1."
- 3. Presses (5) LETTER STUMPER until the desired level appears in the display.
- 4. Presses **60 GO** to begin a sequence. 5. Hears "Press the letters I say" and the
- first letter in the sequence. 6. Enters the letter key he or she hears and
- presses **ENTER**.
 7. Hears another letter in the sequence if
- 7. Hears another letter in the sequence if the first letter is correct.
- Enters the letter keys for the first and second letters in the sequence and presses ENTER.

As long as your child answers correctly, he or she follows the same steps with each additional letter in the sequence. If your child presses an incorrect letter, the sequence ends. The correction and score (based on the number of letters remembered) is given.

Note: The REPLAY and ERASE keys cannot be used in Letter Stumper.

Picture Read

Picture Read helps your child develop vocabulary skills and word meanings. The first section in the *You Can Read!* book should be used with Picture Read.

To use Picture Read, your child:

- 1. Presses PICTURE READ.
- 2. Presses 😉 GO to begin.
- 3. Hears "Find picture number (a number). What word goes here? Say it. Press the letters." (The REPLAY key can be pressed to have the directions repeated).
- 4. Finds the picture number in the You Can Read! book.
- Chooses one of three words in the You Can Read! book that goes with the picture.
- 6. Presses the letter keys to spell the selected word.
- 7. Presses ENTER to check his or her answer.

If your child's answer is incorrect, he or she gets a second chance. If his or her answer is still incorrect, the correct answer is displayed and spoken. Picture Read continues for five pictures. Then, your child's score is spoken and displayed.

Read It

Read It helps your child develop comprehension and word analysis skills. There are three levels of increasing difficulty. Your child can hear and see words in Levels 1 and 2, but can only see them in Level 3 to challenge skills.

To use Read It, your child:

- 1. Presses **READ IT**.
- 2. Sees READ IT 1 and hears "Read It, Level 1."
- 3. Presses **READ IT** until the desired level appears in the display.
- 4. Presses **GO** to begin.
- 5. Hears "Which word? Press the letters."
- Sees and hears a sentence with a word missing. (In Level 3, the words are only displayed.)
- 7. Sees three answer choices and selects the word that correctly completes the sentence. (The REPLAY key can be pressed to have the sentence and words replayed.)
- 8. Enters the letter keys to spell the word he or she selected.
- 9. Presses **ENTER** to check the answer.

If your child's answer is incorrect, he or she gets another chance. If his or her answer is still incorrect, the correct answer is displayed and spoken. Read It continues for five sentences. Then, your child's score is spoken and displayed.


Word Maker

Word Maker helps develop your child's phonetic skills using word families and structural analysis skills. It has three levels of difficulty.

To use Word Maker, your child:

- 1. Presses (F) WORD MAKER.
- 2. Sees WORD 1 and hears "Word Maker, Level 1."
- 3. Presses WORD MAKER until the desired level appears in the display.
- 4. Presses GO GO to begin.
- 5. Hears instructions and sees letters and a cursor appear in the display to show where letter(s) are to be added. For example, your child hears "Add (B) to AT. What word does it make? Say it. Press the letters."
- 6. Presses the letter keys to spell the new word.
- 7. Presses **ENTER** to check the word.

If your child's answer is incorrect, he or she gets another chance. If his or her answer is still incorrect, the correct answer is displayed and spoken. After Word Maker has presented 5 words, your child's score is spoken and displayed.

Discover Who's Who at the Zoo by learning to use contractions and verb endings.

This cartridge expands the built-in vocabulary of the Speak & Read unit by 170 words.

A Dog on a Log Grade 1

Become familiar with those doggone words that rhyme and words with plural and possessive endings.

Practice using words that begin with consonant blends and you'll be on the right track to recognizing new vocabulary words.

This cartridge expands the built-in vocabulary of the Speak & Read unit by 130 words.




